2024 Total Solar Eclipse Monday, April 8

Excitement is building for the epic 2024 total solar eclipse that will cross North America this month!

A **total solar eclipse** occurs when the Moon passes between the Sun and Earth, completely blocking the face of the Sun. The sky will darken as if it were dawn or dusk. The total solar eclipse will be visible along a narrow path stretching from Texas

to Maine, while a partial eclipse will be visible throughout all 48 contiguous U.S. states.

The last time New York State experienced a total solar eclipse was 99 years ago! The last time a total solar eclipse happened in the U.S. was August 21, 2017, with the totality path stretching from South Carolina to Oregon. Taking both the 2017 and 2024 eclipse paths into consideration, they form an 'X" across the country, intersecting near St. Louis. The next time an eclipse will be visible from the contiguous U.S. will be August 23, 2044.

What to expect in Guilderland:

- ► 96.9%—partial eclipse
- ► 3:26 pm—peak view





Viewing Options at GPL

You'll have two opportunities to view the solar eclipse at GPL:

► Indoors @ 1-4 pm

Watch the live stream from NASA with us. It will show live footage from multiple locations, so there isn't any one time to see a total eclipse on the feed. Weather permitting, the first place in continental North

America that will experience totality is Mexico's Pacific coast, at around 2:07 p.m. **No certified eclipse glasses needed!**

For the 2024 annual election, there is one vacancy on the Guilderland Public Library Board of Trustees. Incumbents and eligible candidates must meet the following criteria:

- ► resident of the Guilderland Public Library District for at least 30 days prior to the election
- ► United States citizen; and
- ▶ at least 18 years old.

Eligible candidates interested in running for a **three-year term** may pick up an information packet at the Library's Circulation desk. Each packet includes:

- 1) a memo and a biographical information sheet, which must be returned to Interim Library Director Nate Heyer by Monday, April 22; and
- 2) candidate information and signature sheets from the Guilderland School District, which must be returned to Guilderland Central School District Clerk Linda Livingston by Monday, April 22.

Drug Take Back Day

Saturday, April 27 @ 10 am-2 pm

GPL and the Guilderland Police Department team up every spring and fall for the nationwide Drug Take-Back Day, a semi-annual collaborative effort facilitating safe, anonymous disposal of prescribed and non-prescribed substances.



This drive-through event is held in the library's side parking lot (take Mercy Care lane and then an immediate right).

Please follow these guidelines:

- ▶ Put your medications in a bag, if possible, and remove labels containing personal information
- ▶ Put bagged medications in a place that you can easily access while remaining in your vehicle, or place the bag in your trunk so an officer may retrieve it
- ▶ Drive through to the drop-off point and stay in your vehicle
- ► Follow the officers' instructions

What CAN be disposed:

- Controlled, non-controlled, and over-the-counter substances.
- Medication in its original container or removed from its container and discarded into the disposal boxes.
- Pet medication

What CANNOT be disposed:

No sharps or syringes

No questions asked; no identification required.
