

Dr. Shiva's life has embodied the notion that *one person can truly make a difference*. Through her evolution as an activist, the film also aims to shine a light on where we are today. Industrial food accounts for up to 40% of carbon emissions, while pesticides destroy soils, water systems and biodiversity, and harm human health. Contrary to the spin that industrial food is essential to feeding the world, more than two billion people face food insecurity across the globe—every single day.



NYS Boater Safety Course

This two-day in-person course at the Library provides a broad overview on the



basic principles of safe and responsible boating. Students successfully completing this eight-hour course will earn a safe-boating certificate.

In accordance with Brianna's Law, all motor boat operators born on or after Jan. 1, 1983 need a boating safety certificate in 2023. ALL motor boat operators, regardless of age, will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2025. Beat the rush—get certified NOW!

► NYS Parks and Recreation Fee of \$10 is required for the completed certification

► Attendance both days is required

Quintocracy is a dynamic woodwind quintet who firmly believe that music should be accessible and diverse. They'll perform a



anonymous disposal of prescribed and non-prescribed substances. Controlled, non-controlled, and over the counter substances and pet medications can be disposed; sharps and syringes cannot.

Instructions for this drive-through event:

Put your medications in a bag, if possible, and remove labels containing personal information

Put bagged medications in a place that you can easily access while remaining in your vehicle, or place the bag in your trunk so an officer may retrieve it

- Drive through to the drop-off point and stay in your vehicle
- Follow the officers' instructions

No questions asked; no identification required.
