museums, historical sites, nature venues, and children's museums! A few highlights of December exhibits/events: **The Clark Art Institute, Williamstown, MA**: 20th Century Japanese prints and an outdoor installation on the museum campus called "Trail Signs."

The Hyde Collection, Glens Falls: "Summer Bomb Pop," a collaborative exhibit of colorful abstract art from the museum's collection and the Tang Museum.

The Wild Center, Tupper Lake: Thousands of twinkling lights adorn the Wild Walk. Stroll through Forest Music to surround yourself with immersive music and lights—curated

specifically for the looped trail. Or, visit the otters inside on the Living River Trail.


