


# Attracting Birds to Your Backyard!

## Ulysses S. Grant: The First 200 Years

Ulysses S. Grant was born on April 27, 1822. In this 200th anniversary year of his birth, we will explore the legacy of the 18th President of the United

We'll follow Grant's journey from a hardscrabble beginning, to West Point and the Mexican--American War, to General of the U.S. Army, Civil War commander, and two-term President of the United States. 




