Following Tim Wiles's retirement, GPL administrator Nathaniel Heyer is stepping up from being an Assistant Director into the temporary role of Interim Director. Nate will ensure smooth operations of the library while the Library Board works through the process of selecting and hiring a new permanent Director.



Nate is a lifelong Capital Region resident who brings 15 years of experience as an information professional to the Interim Director role, as well as a multifaceted background in visual art, education, marketing, and entrepreneurship. Nate honed his library leadership and organizational skills during his decade-long tenure at the William K Sanford Town Library in Colonie, and has also worked at many other public libraries in the region, either as an employee or independent technology trainer.

Nate is passionate about collections, digital media, and self-directed education. He is an insatiably curious reader of audiobooks, with a particular taste for nonfiction social science texts, personal growth literature, and cerebral sci-fi novels, and loves checking out board games to play with his family from our Library of Things. Rain, snow, or shine—when he is not wrangling spreadsheets or working with our staff and board, you can find Nate exploring local scenery and hunting down waterfalls and hiking trails.






GPL Sunday Concert: Drank the Gold




The Hollywood Blockbuster: An Illustrated Talk on Zoom
