


take the class outdoors to demonstrate some cuts on live trees on Library property. All skill levels welcome; rain or shine. [R]







July's concert features the talented group Three Quarter North, a local Americana band. Their repertoire ranges from country and bluegrass to blues and acoustic rock, with



Monday, August 7 @ 9:30-11 am Families/All Ages


Ever wondered what lives on the grounds of the Guilderland Public Library? Let's find out together! Albany Pine Bush Preserve
