Yankee Memories with Marty Appel


Wednesday, June 14 @ 7 pm We're pleased to welcome Marty Appel, renowned NY Yankees public relations director, team historian, television producer and author of 25



Flash Fiction: A Writing Workshop with Paul Lamar

Wednesdays, June 14, 21 & 28 @ 2-4 pm


Do you have something to say in 300-1,000 words? This genre requires the writer to pay attention to the

customary features of longer fiction—character, setting, conflict, point of view, language, theme—but in a rather compressed, and challenging, way. Participants will study examples of flash fiction and then, working from prompts, write a couple. **Space is limited.** Presenter Paul Lamar is a popular local writing instructor with years of experience teaching English at Emma Willard School, The College of Saint Rose, SUNY Cobleskill, Greene Correctional Facility, and Sage, as well as GED at St. Peter's Addiction Recovery Center. Since 1996, Lamar has also reviewed theater for the Daily Gazette. [R]

NYS Boater Safety Course

NYS BOATER SAFETY COURSE



to complete a safety course prior to operating any motorized vessel or watercraft. By 2025, ALL motor boat operators, regardless of age, will need a boating safety certificate. Beat the rush—get certified NOW!

Back by popular demand, this eight-hour two-night course is an introduction to the basic principles of safe and responsible boating. Topics covered include rules of the nautical road, safety equipment, special boating-related activities, and much more. Students successfully completing this course will earn a safe-boating certificate.

- ► NYS Parks and Recreation Fee of \$10 is required
- ► Attendance both days is required
- ► Must be at least 10 years old to participate
