Library Director Tim Wiles Announces Retirement

Following ten years at the helm, Library Director Tim Wiles is retiring, effective February 2, 2024. He has led GPL through significant advances over the past decade,



most notably the nine million-dollar building renovation and expansion project, which officially concluded with the opening of Café con Mel in September, 2023.

Tim inherited a facility in need of a makeover, and set out to renovate many aspects of the building and grounds based on public input. Strong community support, plus about 1.3 million dollars in NYS grant funds, bolstered dramatic, long-anticipated improvements, including:

► room to grow: new Children's Library wing with double-sided aquarium; Foundry Teen Room; additional meeting/study rooms; flexible event spaces

 enhanced safety: new roof; sprinkler system; enlarged, reconfigured parking lots; unisex ADA-compliant restrooms; loading dock upgrade; more security cameras
green intitiatives: LED lighting; solar panels; high efficiency HVAC system; low-flow toilets

► technology advances: RFID and automated materials handling (the first library in the area to do so); self-checkout; exterior digital sign; assistive listening technology

► local history implements: Fuller's Tavern (1795) fireplace mantel; Crounse House (1833) front door; Greulich's former cow and our present lobby mascot, Greufus

During Tim's tenure, we expanded our electronic holdings and services significantly in concert with UHLS, including forging new partnerships with neighboring library systems.

an electic menu for all ages and palates to savor. Q: How did you come up with the concept of operating a coffee shop inside of a library?

A: GPL had planned to open an onsite café as part of its 2020-2021 building project. It was one of the top requests received from the public. The Library put out an RFP in July 2021, seeking a suitable vendor, which did not yield any viable candidates. We were operating in Cohoes at the time, but were ready for a change. After applying, it took another 1.5 years and a unanimous vote from the GPL Board of Trustees to officially open our doors on September 6, 2023.

Q: Are you part of the library staff or independent?

A: We are independent. We're proud to work with the Library to offer this amenity to the public. Patrons who stay at GPL for hours appreciate having access to freshly-prepared food and drink, without having to leave or use the vending machine.


