
Spring Craft Fair Saturday, March 9 @ 9:30 am-2 pm



of Irish music featuring traditional favorites—plus some surprises —from the classical to the contemporary.


William Shakespeare's Hamlet: A Reading and Discussion Series on Zoom







Board Candidates Sought

Application Deadline: Monday, April 22 Election: Tuesday, May 21

For the 2024 annual election, there is one vacancy on the Guilderland Public Library Board of Trustees. Incumbents and eligible candidates must be:



- ▶ a resident of the Guilderland Public Library District which covers the same boundaries as the Guilderland Central School District for at least 30 days prior to the election
- ▶ a United States citizen; and
- ► at least 18 years old.

Eligible candidates interested in running for a three-year term may pick up an information packet at the Library's Circulation desk. Each packet includes:

- ▶ a memo from the Interim Library Director followed by a biographical information sheet, which must be returned to the Library's Public Information Officer, Luanne Nicholson, by Monday, April 22, 2024; and
- ► candidate information and signature sheets from the Guilderland School District, which must be returned to Guilderland Central School District Clerk Linda Livingston by Monday, April 22, 2024.
