Phased Reopening, Plus Construction

There is a lot going on here at the library! We have major news on a couple fronts, which I'm excited to share with you.



Phased Reopening

At our recent board meeting, the Trustees approved a phased reopening plan which opens our doors a little wider. We are doing our best to provide library services safely during the pandemic, and we have the added

complication of doing so with a building that will be under construction very soon. Our reopening is phased and gradual, and there will be future updates to the plan listed below.

Expanded Curbside Hours and Browsing

Starts Wednesday, October 7

We will expand to 34 hours of curbside service AND open our Normanskill Room to public browsing on October 7. The schedule for both:

- Monday-Wednesday-Friday, 10 am-4 pm
- Tuesday-Thursday, 1-7 pm
- Saturday, 10 am-2 pm

Normanskill Room Browsing

Starts Wednesday, October 7

We are excited to welcome you back on a limited basis to the Normanskill Room for drop-in patron browsing starting October 7! No appointment is needed. Guidelines:

- Use hand sanitizer upon entering
- Masks required for everyone ages 2+
- Please maintain social distancing of 6+ feet
- Self-service; enter at your own risk
- Restrooms unavailable, due to construction
- Check out all items before leaving
- Room is monitored by video
- Returns still go to the shed with the green canopy

Patrons will enter via the emergency exit door just to the right of our main front door, near our Little Free Library and front benches. The room will be stocked with a curated selection of our newest and most popular items, including children's and young adult materials. Checkout will be via two self-checkout machines. **We ask that patrons keep visits under 15 minutes, with no more than five people**

browsing in the room at any given time. The room will be monitored by video to ensure compliance for the safety of all.

While science tells us that the primary method of transmission of COVID-19 is airborne, it is also possible to get the virus by touching items that others have touched. We ask that patrons be judicious, and only touch items they are seriously considering checking out. For updates, please see: https://guilderlandlibrary.org/gpl-reopening-plan.

Expanded Return Hours

Return of materials continues at the sheds in our parking lot. Items are quarantined for 96 hours prior to being brought into the building and sanitized. We added 15 more hours of accepting returns for your convenience:

- Monday-Friday, 9 am 8 pm
- Saturday, 9 am 2 pm

Building Project Update

We are delighted to announce that construction is slated to begin **October 15!** This project commenced in earnest in 2017, and the referendum was approved by Guilderland voters in May, 2019. We will begin by expanding the children's area



just east of the library. Also in the first phase of construction, the public restrooms will be completely rebuilt and renovated. Once the new space is framed in, we'll move our children's collection into that space. Then we'll tackle the rest of the library's interior, moving collections frequently to allow for construction work on various indoor spaces.


Our parking lot will be significantly larger, with an additional 47 spaces, improved safety features and a relocated book drop that should reduce bottlenecks upon exiting. However, in the short term, our parking capacity will be reduced by about 25%, as the construction firms will fence off a section for their equipment.

While we're working to minimize impact on the public, we'll need to close off sections of the library and the collections for short periods of time. We'll do our best to keep you notified of what's available and what's not. If all goes according to plan, construction will be completed next fall. Election Day is Tuesday, November 3

GPL serves as an Election Day polling place on Tuesday, November 3rd, 6 am - 9 pm. As in past years, voting will be held in our Helderberg Room. Approximately 3,500 citizens are eligible to vote at this polling place, so we have made the decision to suspend curbside pickup and drop-in browsing on Election Day.

If you vote here, please note that **bathrooms will be under construction and thus unavailable to the public.** Also, parking spots will be reduced, due to construction. If you can't find a spot in our main lot, our staff lot across Mercy Care Lane should have available overflow spaces.


Topics will include:

Outdoor Flu Vaccine Clinic

Monday, October 5 @ 11 am-2 pm

We're holding our annual drop-in Flu Vaccine Clinic in the Library parking lot this year. Everyone is required to wear a mask and complete a temperature check and brief



health questionnaire. Both the regular vaccine and the high-dose option for people ages 65 and older will be available (please note: the high-dose option may be subject to availability). The pharmacists can also vaccinate any child age three or older. Please bring your insurance card with you. If you do not have insurance, a vaccine costs \$39.99.



Drug Take-Back Day

Saturday, October 24 @ 10 am-2 pm

Drug Take Back Day provides a safe and convenient way to dispose of substances.

This semi-annual event will take place on a drive-through basis in our staff parking lot (an immediate right turn upon entering MercyCare Lane), in partnership with the Guilderland Police Department. Prescription and over-the-counter medications are accepted, including liquid medicines and pet medications. Instructions:

- Put your medications in a bag, if possible
- Wear a mask covering your nose and mouth
- Put bagged medications in an easily- accessible place while remaining in your vehicle, or place the bag in your trunk so an officer may retrieve it
- Drive through to the drop-off point and stay in your vehicle
- Follow the officers' instructions

Please note: we cannot accept medications before 10 am or after 2 pm, nor can we accept sharps, needles, or lancets. Drug Take Back Day officials will not question anyone or request identification.
