Drug Take Back Day

We're teaming up with the Guilderland Police



Department once again for the semi-annual nationwide Drug Take-Back Day, a collaborative effort to safely remove potentially dangerous controlled substances from our medicine cabinets.

Instructions:

- ▶ Put your medications in a bag, if possible.
- ▶ Wear a mask covering your nose and mouth.
- ▶ Put bagged medications in a place that you can easily access while remaining in your vehicle, or place the bag in your trunk so an officer may retrieve it.
- ▶ Proceed to the drop-off point and stay in your vehicle.
- ▶ Follow the officers' instructions.

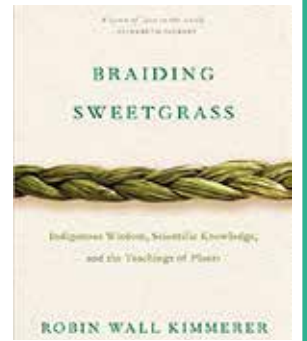
Trick or Treat: How to Handle Halloween Candy Overload
