

WHAT: HOOPLA is a dynamic streaming service that allows you to borrow eBooks, audiobooks, movies, music, comics, and television shows. You can stream from your device or download to read, listen or watch where and when you want. You get up to five

downloads each month. We love their **Categories** feature, where Hoopla has curated lists of content on topics like Black Stories and Experiences; *New York Times* Bestsellers; Audiobooks to Listen to in Your Lifetime; Talking to Kids About Race; National Geographic; and so much more.

WHY: It's all FREE through an arrangement with the Upper Hudson Library System, so there's absolutely no charge to you. The content is remarkably rich—there are literally thousands of titles/shows to choose from. Best of all: **NO** WAIT TIMES! You can choose and immediately start to read/ watch/listen to the item! So if you want to binge listen to the "Hamilton Mixtape," watch the show "Luther" all weekend, or listen to the powerful book, *Stamped From the Beginning*, you don't have to wait for an available copy.



#### Grab-n-Go Storytimes


#### Available bi-weekly on Tuesday September 8 and 21 Curbside pickup only; while supplies last
